Taking Care of Business

When we were kids, my brothers and sisters and I thought that you were not supposed to say the blessing before meals in a restaurant. We were probably afraid of being embarrassed if non-believers saw us praying. I think of that when I hear St. Paul telling Timothy, “God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control” (2 Timothy 1:7). Our readings mention the difficulties that people of faith will encounter, and each reading has its own way of facing those hardships.

Jesus gives the practical advice: Look at the difficulties of being a disciple as just part of your job. So if the Lord says I must forgive those who hurt me, or be patient with customers, or share what I have with the poor—no problem; it’s part of the job of a disciple. Too tired to go to church after work on a holy day? Just taking care of business.

Paul reminds us in the second reading to stir the gifts of the Spirit into flame. If you take time to pray every day, if you look for God in other people, if you see difficulties as your share of the cross—you will begin to experience those gifts.

We can trust that this is more than just wishful thinking by going to the first reading. When the prophet cries out for help with the misery and violence in the world, he hears God’s promise that the vision (of hope for deliverance) will be fulfilled even if it seems to be delayed. We too hear that promise when we start to get discouraged, for God’s promise “will not disappoint” (Habakkuk 2:3). Tom Schmidt

FRASSATI & ACUTIS

Two New Saints for the Modern World

Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901-1925)

Born into an influential Italian family, Pier Giorgio Frassati defied his parents' secular views to live a life devoted to God and service to others. He balanced his studies in engineering with a deep spiritual life, including daily Mass and prayer, dedicating countless hours to charitable work through organizations like the St. Vincent de Paul Society.

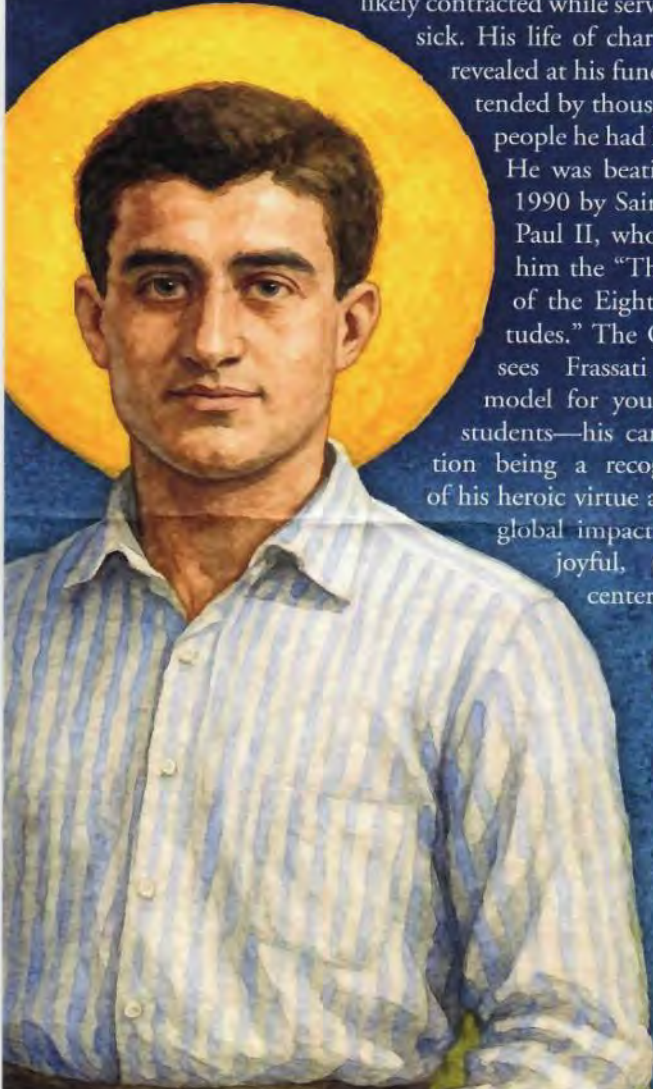
Frassati was known for his joyful personality, love of the outdoors, and advocating for the poor. A passionate mountain climber, he often led friends on excursions, integrating prayer, service, and friendship.

Frassati's generosity extended to giving away his own possessions to help those in need. He died at age 24 from polio,

likely contracted while serving the sick. His life of charity was

revealed at his funeral, attended by thousands of people he had helped.

He was beatified in 1990 by Saint John Paul II, who called him the "The Man of the Eight Beatitudes." The Church sees Frassati as a model for youth and students—his canonization being a recognition of his heroic virtue and the global impact of his joyful, Christ-centered life.



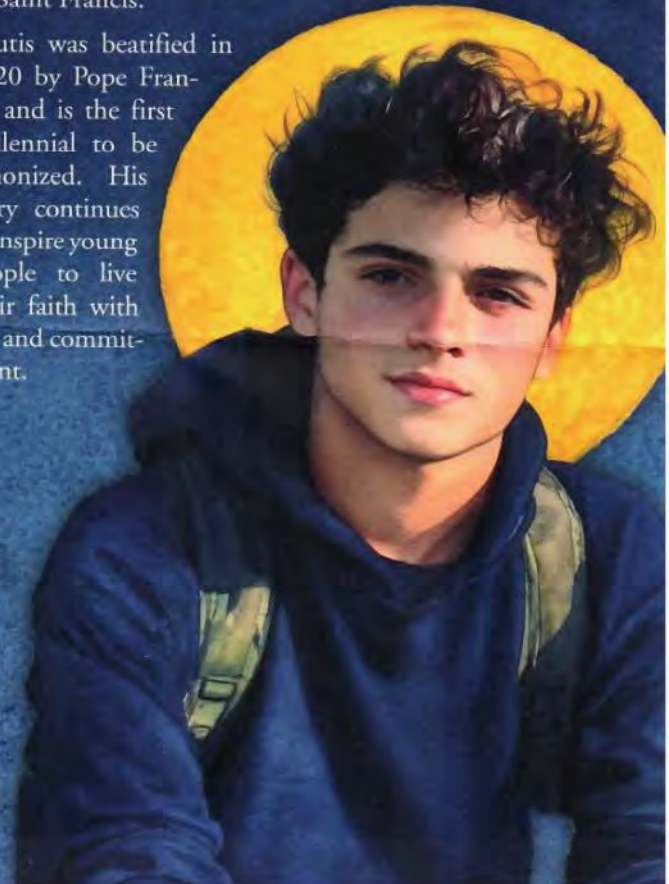
Carlo Acutis (1991-2006)

Carlo Acutis was born on May 3, 1991, in London and raised in Milan, Italy. From a young age, Carlo exhibited an extraordinary devotion to the Eucharist and a profound spiritual maturity. He attended daily Mass, prayed the rosary, and spent hours in Eucharistic adoration. Known for his kindness, humility, and sense of humor, he treated everyone with respect and compassion, especially those who were lonely, bullied, or in need.

What set Carlo apart was how he combined his deep faith with a passion for technology. At the age of 11, he began creating a website cataloging Eucharistic miracles from around the world—a project that later became a traveling exhibit and inspired many to deepen their devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. He believed the internet was a powerful tool for evangelization and said, "The Eucharist is my highway to heaven."

Diagnosed with leukemia at 15, Carlo died in 2006 and was buried in Assisi, a place he loved due to his devotion to Saint Francis.

Acutis was beatified in 2020 by Pope Francis and is the first millennial to be canonized. His story continues to inspire young people to live their faith with joy and commitment.



STEPS TO SAINTHOOD

The process of canonization in the Catholic Church is a rigorous journey that declares a person to be a saint. It involves several stages overseen by the Church to ensure that the candidate's life reflects exceptional holiness and fidelity to God. Here are the main steps:

1. SERVANT OF GOD

The process begins after the candidate has passed away and a minimum of five years has elapsed (though this can be waived by the Pope, as in the case of John Paul II and Mother Teresa).

The local bishop investigates the candidate's life, virtues, and reputation for holiness, collecting testimonies and documents. If the investigation is deemed satisfactory, the bishop sends the results to the *Dicastery for the Causes of Saints* in Rome (previously named the Congregation for the Causes of Saints), and the candidate is titled Servant of God.

2. VENERABLE

The Dicastery for the Causes of Saints examines the candidate's life and writings to determine whether they demonstrated heroic virtue—a life of extraordinary goodness and closeness to God. If approved, the Pope declares the candidate *Venerable*.

3. BEATIFICATION

For a martyr, no miracle is required; their death must be verified as a direct witness to the faith.

For a confessor (someone who lived a holy life but did not die as a martyr), one miracle attributed to their intercession must be verified. This typically involves a medically unexplained healing approved by a team of doctors, theologians, and ultimately the Pope.

Once the miracle is confirmed, the candidate is declared *Blessed*. Beatification allows for limited public veneration, often in the candidate's diocese or region.

4. CANONIZATION

A second miracle, occurring after beatification, must be verified for both martyrs and confessors.

Following a thorough investigation, the Pope officially declares the candidate a Saint in a canonization ceremony, making them universally venerated in the Church. The new saint is assigned a feast day and becomes a model for the faithful.

Canonization is not about perfection but recognizes a person who has cooperated fully with God's grace and can inspire others in their journey of faith.

THE TWO MIRACLES OF PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI

The **first miracle** involved the healing of Domenico Sellan who was suffering from a grave case of tuberculosis in his spine which had left him paralyzed. In 1933 a priest brought him a prayer card of Frassati, and Sellan, praying with faith, was miraculously cured. He lived another 35 years in perfect health. This healing was officially recognized by the Church in 1989, paving the way for Frassati's beatification in 1990.

The **second miracle**, confirmed by Pope Francis on November 25, 2024, involved Father Juan Gutierrez, a seminarian in Los Angeles in 2017. Gutierrez tore his Achilles tendon during a basketball game, facing a painful recovery. Inspired to pray a novena to Frassati, he felt a warm sensation in his ankle during prayer. Days later, an orthopedic surgeon found no trace of the injury, despite prior MRI evidence. The healing was verified through a diocesan inquiry and Vatican examination, deemed inexplicable by medical experts.

THE TWO MIRACLES OF CARLO ACUTIS

The **first miracle**, recognized for Acutis' beatification involved the healing of Matheus Vianna, a Brazilian boy born with a rare pancreatic disorder that caused severe vomiting and malnourishment. During a prayer service where a relic of Acutis was present, Matheus' mother prayed for intercession while Matheus himself touched the relic and expressed his desire to stop vomiting. From that moment on he no longer experienced symptoms, with his pancreas healing completely, a recovery doctors deemed inexplicable. The Vatican verified this miracle in February 2020.

The **second miracle**, recognized by Pope Francis in May 2024, involved a young Costa Rican woman named Valeria Valverde. Valeria suffered a severe brain hemorrhage from a bicycle accident in Florence, Italy, where she was studying. Doctors gave her a very low chance of survival. Her mother, Lilliana, went on a pilgrimage to Assisi and prayed at Carlo Acutis' tomb, asking for his intercession for her daughter's healing. On the same day, Valeria began to breathe independently again, and recovered quickly. The Vatican recognized this miraculous healing, paving the way for Acutis to become a saint.
