Emmaus Amazement

Today's Gospel has some surprises for the disciples going to Emmaus. The first is that Luke tells us Jesus appeared to them, "but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him" (Luke 24:16). More likely, they were prevented by their lack of faith. They knew that Jesus had died, so this man who looked familiar couldn't be him. All they had heard was that Jesus' body was missing from the tomb. That leads to the second point. They were amazed at how Jesus explained the scriptures. Even the disciples had not thought of them as predicting Jesus' suffering and death. Yet they seem to know the truth of what Jesus was saying. Their story can help us, too.

If you find you are not always able to see Jesus in the

people or events of your life, you may need to stretch your faith. One way to do that is to discuss it with others. The two disciples were stretching their faith as they discussed what they had heard. Your faith will grow as you learn to express it. Another way to stretch your faith is to read and pray over the scriptures. Ask what God is trying to tell you in them. The disciples on the way to Emmaus began to see how Jesus fulfilled the promises found there.

Ask God to help you see Jesus in other people. Receive Jesus in Communion as often as you can (at least once a week). Trust him and expect to see Jesus both in people around you and in the changes that come into your life. The more you look for Jesus, the easier it is to see him. Tom Schmidt

GOD BLESS OUR DEAD

UNDERSTANDING THE ORDER OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK AND THEIR PASTORAL CARE: VIATICUM

Viaticum is the last sacrament of the Christian. Through this sacrament, the dying person receives the seed of eternal life. Viaticum is a special sign of the Paschal Mystery, Christ's Passover from death to resurrection, which is celebrated in every Mass. Additionally, for the dying, the sacraments of Penance and Anointing culminate in the reception of Eucharist as Viaticum

THE MINISTER OF VIATICUM:

The ordinary and usual minister of Viaticum is a priest with a care of souls, i.e., a pastor, a parochial vicar, a chaplain, and with regard to those living in a religious house, a superior of a clerical religious institute or society of apostolic life. Viaticum is among those functions especially entrusted to pastors. When necessity requires it or with the presumed permission of the competent minister, any duly appointed layperson may do so.

THE RECIPIENT OF VIATICUM:

The recipients of Viaticum is a member of the Christian faithful who is in danger of death from any cause; those who are able to receive Holy Communion are obliged to receive Viaticum. While anointing of the sick is to be received by those who are in danger of death because of sickness, mental illness or old age, Viaticum may be given to those who are in danger of death from any cause ---not only from intrinsic one like sickness but also from extrinsic sources like capital punishment. In light of the meaning of Viaticum as "the last Sacrament of the Christian, it is fitting that it be received when the danger of death is proximate or imminent. Thus, in the course of a serious illness, the general pattern is:

- the reception of Penance when necessary
- the Anointing of the Sick when one begins to be in danger of death
- the Apostolic Pardon at the point of death

CELEBRATING VIATICUM:

It would be hoped that before the celebration of Viaticum, ministers prepare the sick person for the liturgy and their participation in it to the best extent possible. The celebration would also be prepared and arranged in light of the sick person's condition, and particularly with the family of the sick person. If possible, the celebration of Viaticum could take place during mass, highlighting the connection between participation in the Eucharist and reception of Holy Communion; and, to allow the sick person to receive Holy Communion under both kinds. According to the rubrics, the Ritual Mass "For the Administering of Viaticum" or the Votive Mass of "The Most Holy Eucharist" may be used. In addition, the readings would be taken from the Lectionary for Mass, Vol IV, #796-800 or Chapter VII in the Order of the Anointing of the Sick and of Their Pastoral Care. If administering of Viaticum outside of Mass, only the species of Bread is administered except for those who are unable to receive it. In this case, some of the Precious Blood may be reserved after Mass, transferred to a closed vessel excluding the possibility of spilling. Viaticum may be administered outside of Mass on any day of the year, even Holy Saturday, the day when the Church abstains from the sacrifice of Mass and reception of Holy Communion. The rites for the Administering of Viaticum are also found in Chapter IV and Appendix IV of the Order, specifically "The Order of Offering the Sacraments to a Sick Person Who Is in Imminent Danger of Death." While the Sacraments in danger of Death follow the general pattern described above, the Emergency Rite differs because of the condition of the Sick person. Because the danger of death is clearly pressing, the pattern changes to an opportunity for Penance, the Administration of Viaticum, and then, if time permits, the Anointing of the Sick. The Rite of Viaticum consists of six parts: The Introductory Rites, The Reading of Sacred Scripture, The profession of baptismal Faith, the Litany, Viaticum, and the Concluding Rites. The rite for use by priests and with some modifications by Deacons] includes a sprinkling rite, an opportunity for sacramental confession, and the Apostolic Pardon, which are all absent from the rite used by extraordinary minister.
